Do you know about 'Phase Free'? - Cooping with disasters with familiar items!

There are many everyday items that can be useful during disasters. The concept of using familiar items in time of a disaster is called 'Phase Free', which has the advantage of being able to use things you are accustomed to during disasters without the need for special preparations. For example...

- Electricity Black-out: Camping gear can be used indoors as well. Many lanterns are bright enough to serve as lighting. A mobile battery can also be used as a substitute for the outlet of electricity for using small appliances, not just for charging handy phones.
- Electricity and City-gas cut off: If you have a portable gas stove, you can eat warm meals even if the gas or IH stove cannot be used.

• Emergency measures until you can safely get to a hospital: With a hand towel, you can easily provide first aid for injuries by tying it around your neck.

- ★ Can regular meals become Emergency supplies? Let's practice Rolling stock Rolling stock is a method of stockpiling that is useful in emergencies. It involves purchasing an extra amount of food stuffs regularly and replenishing them as they decrease. This way, you can always have a certain amount of food available. By consuming items that are close to their expiration date first, you can also become more aware of approaching expiry.
- * Use rolling stock method for your car's gasoline: After a disaster occurs, it may become difficult to refuel your car. Just like with food supplies, use the concept of rolling stock and refuel when your gasoline level goes below half.
